Hosting a 'Communi-Tea Party'

Get a group of people together from your community, for example, from your:

- Work place
- School, college or university
- Street or neighbourhood
- Community centre or hub
- Local sports team or theatre group
- Place of worship

Then:

Use the materials in the Get Involved Pack to host a **'Communi-Tea Party'**. There are lots of things you can do to get everyone involved, such as:

- Hang the bunting and put up the posters around your venue
- Use the recipe card to bake your own cakes
- Top your cakes with our 'Uno the Unicorn' edible cake toppers
- Have a go at playing the games on the Games Card (you can find more games ideas on the SCLD website)
- Plant your Grow Wild seeds and watch the flowers grow.
